2020 Event Series – Euclid Creek PIPE Committee Work Plan (Approved March 3, 2020)

10/06/2020 Work Plan Summary

14 involvement events or activities and 6 educational programs have been held in 2020 for the Euclid Creek Watershed Committee Communities. Virtual programming on Green Yards Healthy Homes, Backyard Stream Maintenance, Tree Care, Rain Barrels, Rain Gardens, and water quality monitoring is available on demand for promotion to residents. Simulated live presentations can be catered to individual communities for promotion and viewing at a specific time and date.

Cuyahoga SWCD is making every effort to have an involvement event in each community this year, but with COVID protocols they must be outdoors and limited to 9 attendees and 1 staff. For communities which an involvement event was not held, Cuyahoga SWCD will bring a sign in form, pledges, and hand out materials (mugs, signs, and bags) that the community can distribute to residents, staff, and or contractors who take the pledge. These pledges can count for involvement. The virtual Green Yards Healthy Homes webinar can also be used to count for involvement as those who view the webinar can pledge to make a green product at home. If the community prefers not to have an involvement activity this year due to COVID, Cuyahoga SWCD will work with the community over the course of the permit term to make sure all requirements are met (multiple events will be held in 2021, 2022, 2023, and/or 2024).

The planned in person Master Rain Gardener program was moved online. Live classes were hosted in May. Classes were then repeated as "simulated live" in July. 65 students took the May and July Classes with Cuyahoga SWCD. 11 of the students resided in Euclid Creek Watershed Communities. CRWP and Summit SWCD also held online Master Rain Gardener Programming in 2020. So far 59 rain gardens have been installed by Northeast Ohio Master Rain Gardener graduates. 5 professionals have been certified, and six graduates have adopted public rain gardens and perform routine maintenance.

Education Theme for 2020-2024: Lake Erie Starts Here - Everyone lives in a watershed, and in Cuyahoga County everyone lives in the Lake Erie watershed. Because of this watershed connection, our activities at home, at school, at work, and throughout the community directly impact not only Lake Erie, but also our local waterways. Outreach and involvement activities will identify this connection and provide recommendations and opportunities to make a positive watershed impact to various target audiences.

MESSAGES for 2020-2024:

Message 1 (Winter): Sensible Salting

Road salt directly impacts aquatic life when it runs off into local streams. By adopting alternative deicing techniques and sensible salting strategies, the amount of road salt reaching local waterways will be reduced.

Message 2 (Spring): Backyard Conservation

Small changes in lawn care, landscaping and soil health management practices can lead to local water quality improvements. Converting lawn areas to native trees, shrubs, rain gardens, wildflowers or prairie grasses improves soil health, increases rainwater infiltration and reduces pollution from lawn runoff. Rain Barrels improve water quality by reducing stormwater runoff and therefore the delivery of pollutants to the storm sewer system.

Message 3 (Summer): Waste – There Is No Away

Waste materials that are improperly managed or disposed of negatively impact water quality and aquatic ecosystems.

Message 4 (Fall): Trees

Trees intercept and infiltrate rainwater before it can be converted to runoff. Properly planting and maintaining native trees reduces runoff and improves water quality.

Message 5:

We all live in a watershed and our actions on the land directly affect the quality of our water.
